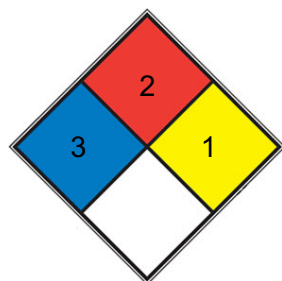
Advice for firefighters
