We have no description of any toxic symptoms.

#### Other information

The following applies to aromatic amines in general: systemic effect: methaemoglobinaemia with headache, cardiac dysrhythmia, drop in blood pressure, dyspnoea, and spasms, principal symptom: cyanosis (blue discolouration of the blood).

Under given conditions, contact with nitrites or nitric acid can lead to the formation of nitrosamines, which have shown themselves to be carcinogenic in animal experiments.

The following applies to azo dyes in general: azo dyes containing a carcinogenic aryl amine component are suspected of possessing a carcinogenic potential. It is therefore recommended that the substance be handled as if it possessed the properties of the basic amine.
