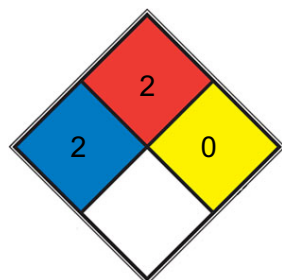
### Specific Hazards Arising from the Chemical

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## SECTION 6: Accidental release measures
