#### General advice

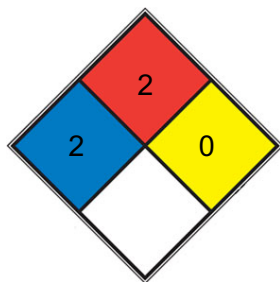
