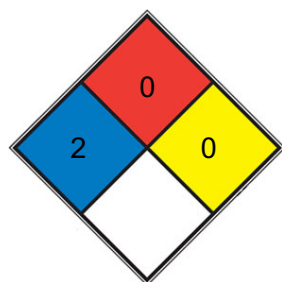

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## SECTION 6: Accidental release measures

### **Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures**
