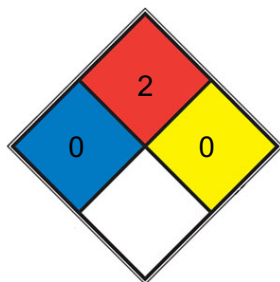
## Advice for firefighters
