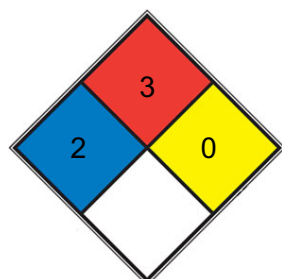
Flammable. Risk of ignition. Vapors may travel to source of ignition and flash back. Containers may explode when heated.
