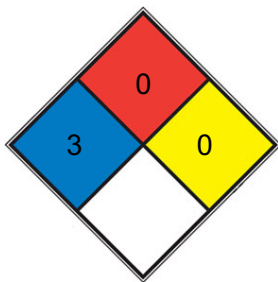
Specific extinguishing methods
