#### General advice

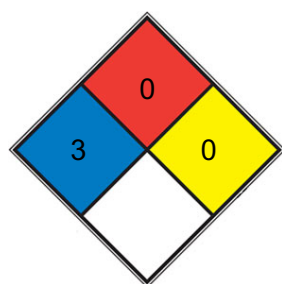
