## SECTION 4: First aid measures

### 4.1 Description of first-aid measures

#### General advice

#### If inhaled

Histologically, tetraalkyl tin compounds show a decrease in cytoplasmic basophilia of the liver, chromatolysis of the Purkinje cells of the cerebellum, and increase in the water content of the brain and spinal cord., Dermatitis,

Nausea, Dizziness, Headache, To the best of our knowledge, the chemical, physical, and toxicological properties have not been thoroughly investigated.
